



Chennai, once a small fishing village called Madraspatnam, came into the limelight when the British built Fort St. George in 1644. What began as a trading hub soon grew into a vibrant city, blending the traditions of ancient towns like Mylapore and Triplicane with modern growth. After independence, it flourished as a center of education, arts, and industries, and in 1996, the city was officially renamed Chennai. Today, it is known as the “Gateway to South India,” where tradition meets modern life, and is also hailed as the “Health Capital of India” for its world-class hospitals and advanced medical care.

Places to Visit



Marina Beach

One of the longest urban beaches in the world (13 km), Marina Beach is the pride of Chennai. It was developed during the British era by Governor Mountstuart Elphinstone Grant Duff. The beach is famous for its sunrise views, memorials of Tamil leaders like Anna and MGR, and bustling evening food stalls. It’s a favorite spot for locals & tourists alike.

Valluvar Kottam

A monument dedicated to the revered Tamil poet-saint Thiruvalluvar, who authored the Thirukkural. The structure, completed in 1976, is shaped like a temple chariot and houses a 39-meter-high stone statue of Thiruvalluvar. The hall inside can accommodate 4000 people, and the 133 chapters of Thirukkural are inscribed on granite panels.





Theosophical Society

Founded in 1875, the Theosophical Society in Adyar is a global spiritual movement promoting universal brotherhood and comparative study of religion, philosophy, and science. The lush 260-acre campus has a serene atmosphere, with attractions like the famous 450-year-old Banyan tree, serene gardens, and the Adyar river flowing beside it.

Mahabalipuram

Though slightly outside Chennai, this UNESCO World Heritage site is a must-visit. Built by the Pallava kings in the 7th-8th centuries, Mahabalipuram is famous for its rock-cut temples, shore temple, cave sanctuaries, and the iconic “Descent of the Ganges” bas-relief. The site beautifully blends art, mythology, and seafront views.



Fort St. George

Established in 1644 by the British East India Company, Fort St. George marks the beginning of modern Chennai (then Madras). It was the first English fortress in India and served as a trading post as well as a military stronghold. Today, it houses the Tamil Nadu Legislative Assembly and a museum showcasing colonial history.

Government Museum, Egmore

Founded in 1851, it is the second oldest museum in India. The museum has one of the world's finest collections of Bronze artifacts, especially Chola bronzes like the iconic Nataraja. It also features galleries on archaeology, anthropology, numismatics, and zoology, making it a hub of knowledge and culture.
